

Just , recently, and lately.

Used with present perfect, indicate that the action happened only a short time ago.



JUST, represent the most recent action

POSITION: between **have** and **the past participle**.

“ALINE CAN’T ANSWER THE PHONE NOW BECAUSE SHE HAS JUST ARRIVED FROM PARIS”



RECENTLY, indicates that the action
happened not long ago.

POSITION: between **have** and **past participle** or
at the end of the sentence.

“ MOM AND DAD HAVE **RECENTLY GOTTEN
BACK FROM THEIR VACATION IN BUENOS
AIRES”**



LATELY, represents an action that has **started in a recent past and still in progress.**

POSITION: at the end of the sentence.

**“ I HAVEN´T SPENT MUCH MONEY IN CLOTHES
LATELY”**
